### <u>August</u>

## <u>March</u>

At this year's SchoggiFestival in Zurich we are organizing a live online interview with Kathrin Heitz Tokpa, the president of CABOZ Action Côte d'Ivoire. On 26 March at 13:00 summer time we will discuss the "Risks of child labour in the cocoa industry – what can be done? (taking place in German) and would love to meet any members and friends in person there. Come and enjoy some very special chocolate and cocoa juice at the festival. And try out some 'savon noir', a black soap made from burnt cocoa husks and palm kernel oil by members of one of the savings groups CABOZ Action supports.



### **February**

The Village Savings and Loan Associations (VSLAs, in French AVECs) have proved to be very popular. With the support of the Rainforest Alliance and CABOZ AG, we were able to help set up 6 new VSLAs at the beginning of the year – 4 in Soubré and 2 in Duekoué. With the groups in Duekoué, we are experimenting with setting up school funds to help parents equip their children with what they need when the school year starts.

### January

Having good relations with the local state authorities is essential for the long-term acceptance of CABOZ Action's work and is particularly important in preventing the risks of child labour. Our team has therefore informed the Centre for Social Work (Centre Social) of the Platform "*Système d'Observation et de Suivi du Travail des Enfants en Côte d'Ivoire*" (SOSTECI) and the prefecture in Soubré about our project with the Rainforest Alliance and the new approach we are taking to address this sensitive issue. We are now in a better position to cooperate with state agencies should we encounter human rights violations or cases of hardship.
